





Language Access Map Color Chart


The following is a list of possible state color combinations that indicate the type of Spanish language content available on state coalition websites.

-  A state with both teal and purple indicates that its one dual coalition or two coalition websites include relevant content in Spanish on DV and SA issues.

-  A state that is colored tan and includes either teal or purple indicates that it has half a million or more Hispanic residents and only one type of information is offered in Spanish on the state coalition website: either on DV or SA.

-  A state that is colored orange and either teal or purple indicates that it has one state coalition website with content (on DV or SA) that has been previously translated into Spanish by a person and the other coalition website relies on on-the-spot machine translations.

-  A state that is colored tan and orange indicates that it has half a million or more Hispanic residents and that the only Spanish language content included on the state coalition website is created through on on-the-spot machine translations.

-  A white state indicates that it has a Hispanic population under 500,000 and that it does not include any victim information content in Spanish on either state coalition website.

The aim of the map is to draw attention to the growing unmet needs of Spanish-speaking survivors of sexual and intimate partner violence by focusing on those states with the largest Hispanic populations.
